Emergency Cover over the Holidays



We will be closed Wednesday 25 to Monday 30 December and Wednesday 1 to Monday 6 January. Tradesmen are on holiday 25 December to 6 January. In an emergency, call James Frew Ltd (for heating/hot water) or City Building (for all other repairs). An 'Emergency' is when there is a risk to health and safety or to prevent serious damage, e.g. burst pipes. We will respond within 4 hours. After the emergency other work might be dealt with after 6 January. No heating or hot water is not an emergency. But James Frew Ltd. will respond, within reason. If you call before 19.00 they will try to come out. Otherwise, they will come the following day. Our Staff are on call if you need to speak to us in an emergency. Hopefully, you won't need them! (Two questions to ask yourself. 1) Do

you know how to turn the water off if there is a burst? 2) Do you have house contents insurance?)

Cleansing Department at Christmas

Bins will be emptied as normal over the holidays but the **last Bulk Uplift** before Christmas is on **Thursday 19 December**. The **next after Christmas** is on **Thursday 16 January**. If you put out bulk items make sure they remain neat & tidy until they're collected. It only take a few minutes to flatten cardboard boxes! Don't dump stuff at the statue in Cloverbank Street! To report illegal dumping call Clean Glasgow or use the 'My Glasgow' App on your mobile phone. Over the holidays you can take bulk or excess waste to any recycling centre. The nearest is at Easter

Queenslie, 90 Easter Queenslie Road, Glasgow G33 4UL. It's open 7 days a week, 8am to 8pm (last entry at 7.45pm). Centres are closed on Christmas Day and New Year's Day and close at 6pm (last entry at 5.45pm) on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve. Let's look after our area during the holidays!



Fire Safety at Christmas

More than 500 accidental house fires were recorded across Scotland during last year's festive season, according to the latest statistics revealed today by the **Scottish Fire and Rescue Service**. Figures show the extent of seasonal dwelling fires responded to by firefighters, with a total of 509 incidents recorded between December 10 and January 14. The numbers further revealed that of the 91 people who sadly became a casualty of these fires, 37 were aged 60 or over – more than 40%.

The hard-hitting numbers were highlighted as the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service launches its winter safety campaign today, including a hard-hitting national television advert highlighting the dangers of cooking while under the influence of alcohol. The festive period is traditionally one of the busiest times of year for SFRS and its partners – with the increase in accidental house fires during the period typically caused by a higher use of heating and electrical appliances - as well as higher alcohol consumption, decorations and the traditional use of candles also playing a role.





Ross Haggart, assistant chief officer, SFRS director of prevention and protection, said: "Ultimately, we want people to remember the festive period for all the right reasons. "When our firefighters have to attend a fire in someone's house at Christmas time, and we enter a house which is burning but full of Christmas presents and decorations – it's heartbreaking. But unfortunately, the festive period sees potentially deadly combinations come together – increased use of electricity, drinking alcohol and cooking, decorations being put up near heat sources. It's all too easy to think that it will never happen to you - but it can. That's why we are appealing to communities across Scotland – don't let Christmas end, or your New Year start, with tragedy."

This winter SFRS will work closely with local communities and partner agencies to keep Scotland safe from fire and other emergencies. However, Mr Haggart is urging communities to play their part by ensuring that the most elderly and vulnerable members of the community are properly supported this Christmas and into 2020. He added: "I would directly appeal to people to check if their elderly relatives, neighbours or friends are in need of our support and to contact us. Home fire safety visits are a key pillar of our prevention work that help safeguard the public – especially vulnerable residents. These are free pre-arranged visits where SFRS staff identify signs to protect people and their homes. SFRS staff can also identify hazards in the home, help plan escape routes and provide information about smoke, heat and carbon monoxide alarms."

Cooking remains the number one cause of fires in the home in Scotland, with alcohol a top contributing factor. During the festive period, the SFRS traditionally sees a rise in incidents related to cooking while someone is under the influence of alcohol. ACO Haggart continued: "When it comes to celebrating and marking the occasion – please do not drink, then attempt to cook. Cooking remains the number one cause of house fires in Scotland and often alcohol is a contributing factor, especially during this period. "Consider making something beforehand and have it prepared, or wait until you are no longer affected by alcohol."

Community safety minister Ash Denham said: "While we want people to be able to celebrate and relax over the festive period, it is extremely important that they also keep themselves and others safe. For that reason I'd urge people to follow the advice of the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service and act responsibly."

Leaflets on how to prevent fires in the home and what to do if one starts in their building were distributed to residents in high-rise properties last week. Advice, produced by the **Scottish Government** and the **Scottish Fire and Rescue Service**, is being delivered to high-rise homes from this month and will also be available in libraries and community centres in all 15 local authorities with the properties. Guidance is also being published for those responsible for fire safety in high-rise buildings, including councils, housing associations, owners and private landlords.

An email from Glasgow City Council about the Blochairn Road Recycling Depot



'Due to structural damage, the council's waste transfer station at Easter Queenslie has been closed to all waste deliveries. To ensure that daily waste collection operations within the east of the city are not impacted by the closure alternative tipping and bulking locations have been created within existing council waste facilities. Due to its central position and active waste management licence Blochairn waste transfer station has been identified and used to manage agreed waste streams which would have previously been tipped at Easter Queenslie. The remaining waste materials are being sent to the councils other facilities at Shieldhall, Dawsholm & Polmadie. Materials levels within the transfer station are kept to a minimum and loaded into articulated vehicles to be transferred onto the councils waste contractors for processing. SEPA have been made aware of the

changes to the operation at Blochairn and will monitor to ensure compliance with the sites waste management licence. I can fully appreciated the concerns from the local residents regarding the increased activity on site and the impact it may have however I can assure you that additions measures are being employed on site to mitigate these risks during this period. Glasgow councils structural experts are currently reviewing Queenslie to determine options for the repair/ upgrading of the site. Once these options have been reviewed I will have a clear understanding of the future needs of Blochairn and the councils other waste facilities. Glasgow council are committed to provide an effective waste management service to maximise recycling and recovery during this this difficult period and will look to update yourself and the local residents when more information is available'.

Keep Your Building Safe!

The Scottish Fire and Rescue Service urge you to think what you would do in the event of a fire - to



have a **Fire Escape Plan**. You should not have anything in the common areas that would block your escape (common areas are not for storage). Imagine a smoke filled close - you can't see - you're trying to get your family out. You don't want to be tripping over bikes or scooters or prams. And fire fighters need to get into the building quickly. So, please keep your own belongings in your own house. Keep common areas clear of clutter. Keep your building safe!

Congratulations to Greta Thunberg - TIME Person of the Year 2019

The 16 year old Swedish schoolgirl, who inspired a global movement to fight climate change, is Time magazine's Person of the Year; the youngest person to be chosen since the award began in 1927. At a UN climate change summit in Madrid she urged world leaders to stop using "creative PR" to avoid real

action. She said, the next decade would define the planet's future. Last year, Greta started an environmental strike by missing lessons most Fridays to protest outside the Swedish parliament building. It sparked a worldwide movement. Since then, she has inspired millions of students to join protests around the world as was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize. At the UN Climate Conference in New York in September, she blasted politicians for relying on young people for answers to climate change. In a now-famous speech, she said: "You have stolen my dreams and my childhood with your empty words. We'll be watching you."



Tenant Bonus Scheme: Christmas Bonus

In 2001, Blochairn became the first housing organisation in Glasgow to offer a cash bonus to its tenants. We wanted to recognise how important it is that tenants play their part in their community; making their area a place where people want to live - a place to be proud to say they come from.

The Bonus Scheme helps us to provide a first class service and a pleasant living environment because it encourages residents to work together. It's about co-operation; working together. We know that some people will struggle to pay rent. If they work with us and keep to a payment plan, that's fine. If there is a problem with nuisance to neighbours or with the stairs/close/garden/bin store and we need to visit and write over and over again, that's a problem. In 2004, we introduced a monthly Prize Draw. Of course, you need to be 'in it to win it'.





The Bonus is not a legal right. And there has to be subjective assessment, which isn't easy. A great looking property might have only one or two people doing all the work. The property might look terrible but one or two are really trying. Our Staff want everyone to receive a Christmas Bonus. Telling someone a few weeks before Christmas that it can't be paid is heartbreaking.



Last year we got our tenants more involved in the decision. Our questionnaire asked whether they had kept to their Tenancy Agreement and whether they felt they had contributed to the wellbeing of their community? And

- Is my home in reasonable condition with a reasonable standard of hygiene and cleanliness? Is there paint on radiators, fans, light fittings or kitchen units?
- Is my rent account clear? Am I co-operating to deal with problems?
- Do I have outstanding debts (e.g. rechargeable repairs)? Am I keeping to an arrangement?
- * Is my front garden and back court tidy and free of litter?
- Is my bin store clean and tidy; refuse bagged and placed into the bin and bulk refuse dealt with properly?
- * Are my stairs and close clean, tidy and free of litter; brushed and washed regularly? Are walls, banisters and windows clean? Are bags of rubbish, boots, shoes, etc. outside the door? Are prams, bikes, scooters, etc. lying around?
- Do I report repairs when they are needed. Do I give reasonable access to workmen? Is my Gas Safety Service done on time?
- * Do I report graffiti or clean it myself?
- * Are my children causing a problem for other residents? Are they helpful, thoughtful and considerate towards their neighbours? Do they drop litter?
- Do my pets cause a nuisance? Do I allow them to foul any common area?
- * Do I treat the Association's staff reasonably? Am I ever threatening or abusive?


This year, of the 198 tenants who returned the questionnaire, 194 received the Christmas Bonus. We hope that we can increase this number next year. So, 68% tenants received a £75 Christmas Bonus. Thank you to them and to everyone who helps us to make Blochairn a place where people want to live and are proud to say they come from.
